In addition to the David Rockwell-designed Ninety Acres Restaurant & Cooking School, which currently operates on the site, Pendry Hotels plans to restore the estate with careful attention to detail, as well as expand the already-sprawling space by several thousand square feet. This will start with an adjoining hotel boasting of 66 guest rooms and suites, along with the full-service Spa Pendry offering an "extensive health & wellness curriculum, fitness center, swimming pool and tennis courts, private membership club, and a variety of classic and unique outdoor activities," all of which are set among scenic trails and pathways groomed for hiking, biking and horseback riding.
